238	ACCIDENT INVESTIGATION FOR MUNICIPAL EMPLOYEES – 20 Minutes. Teaches how to conduct proper investigation, and how to use prior investigations to reduce future accidents. Spells out the elements of investigation, do's and don'ts at accident sites, how to interview witnesses, prepare reports, recommend actions and more. VHS
13	ACCIDENT INVESTIGATION: HOW TO INVESTIGATE -- 13 Minutes. Instructs supervisors on the basics of accident investigation, and reviews the important points to consider when gathering the facts for an accident report. The video offers a scenario of an accident investigation. VHS
